Guthrie Theater

A remarkable piece of architecture that houses 3 stages, producing classical and contemporary works. Freely open to the public 7 days a week. See a play, take a tour, or just enjoy the space.

Weisman Art Museum

Designed by Frank Gehry, the museum glitters from the East Bank of the University of Minnesota campus. Presents and interprets works of art, offering exhibitions that place art within relevant contexts. Freely open to the public Tuesday-Sunday.

Minneapolis Sculpture Garden

One of the city's crown jewels of both our parks system and arts culture, the Garden showcases more than 40 works of art from the Walker Art Center's collections, including the iconic *Spoonbridge and Cherry*. Freely open to the public every day of the year.
